01 CHOOSE YOUR NEXT STORY.

Use the reading, viewing and listening queues to keep a short list. You do not need to buy a title to use this journal; borrowed books and lawful free media work too.

02 BUILD A THREE-PAGE CASE WORKSPACE.

For each of four stories, note the people and dates, compare two accounts, and reflect on what changed your understanding. Print another workspace whenever you need one.

03 SEPARATE THE ACCOUNT FROM THE EVIDENCE.

Record a page, timestamp or public source link beside important claims. Label opinion, disputed information and dramatic invention instead of blending them with established facts.

04 KEEP CURIOSITY RESPECTFUL.

These stories concern real people. Do not contact families, speculate about private individuals or visit private property. If material feels overwhelming, pause or choose a different story.

Print at actual size on US Letter paper (8.5 x 11 inches), or choose Fit when printing on A4. Interior pages use light rules to reduce ink. This PDF has writing spaces, not interactive form fields; use a PDF annotation app if you prefer typing.
